In the month of April the Keystone team is focused on Career Planning activities and information to share. You'll notice in this month's newsletter that our Guidance team is offering a webinar focused on career readiness and our Academics and Guidance teams are working closely to make sure the AP students are well prepared to take the upcoming exams. Regardless of resources available to you, having active conversations with your students, even during their elementary and middle school years, is important in helping to guide them to the correct course choices as they transition into any high school program. At Keystone, during the middle school years, students have the ability to select the elective courses which they are most interested in and this is a really good chance to help students build skills that may apply to their future career. If they are unsure, don't worry, we also offer a career exploration course for our 8th grade students to help them explore their interests. While career course enrollment can be a huge help, our Guidance team has developed resources for students in both the middle and high school Guidance Services course. (This course is available in their Blackboard classroom). Within each of these courses, student are able to access an entire unit dedicated to Career Exploration and gain access to a free online resource through Choices 360. This will allow your student to complete assessments which can help them determine their interests, skills work values, and use them to find career options that align to them. We encourage all students to take a look!



Keystone Career Month

Everything from course selection to choosing extracurricular activities can be used to help your student think about their career. Many of us have seen the basic career assessments that can show a student what careers may match their interests. But there are also tools in the Guidance Resource Center that can help students discover their work values, transferrable skills, and even an ability profiler. These tools can be taken by the student and only last anywhere from 10-90 minutes. Trained professional counselors are available to help students understand the results of these assessments and how they can be used in accordance with a student's post graduate plans!

The Keystone Guidance team is available to help students answer questions about college, financial aid, trending careers, and everything in between. We are available via email, phone conferencing and even Skype. As school counselors we are not here to give your student an envelope with the name of the job they should have by the time they graduate. 
Keystone facebook Live Events



SAT/ACT PREPARATION

Guidance frequently gets asked by students and parents about ACT and SAT Test Prep programs. While Keystone offers access to some independent study materials through the Guidance Services Resource Center, many students want a more formal study program.

K12 has two new offerings to meet the need:

- 1. A 6-week teacher-led test prep program, with 6 hours of live instruction offered per week, online study program, practice tests, and live teacher help desk sessions.
- 2. A 6-week study program, supported by teachers, with access to online lessons, recorded teacher instruction, live help desk sessions, and practice tests.

To get the most out of either option,

- Determine when you are planning to take the ACT or SAT test, and sign up for the test you want at a location near you.

TAKING THE A.P. EXAMS?

In preparation for the AP exams that will be administered in the May, all AP teachers will be hosting a live lesson once a week starting the week of March 27th and ending the week of April 17th. The lessons will be scheduled for 1 hour each.

The topics for each lesson are listed below by week: (this outline is the same for all teachers)

Week of March 27th: Exam Discussion and Online Study Materials and Sites (What is on the exam? What types of test questions? How long for each section? How to approach the test questions?) (discussion of several creditable website and resources that students and use to help prepare for the test, and a walk through of them to clearly show what is on the websites, and how the material can be used and relates to the test)

Week of April 3rd: Specific Skills and Content Tested 1 (content/skills that will be tested on. Example: writing thesis statements, or how to complete document based-questions)

Week of April 10th: Specific Skills and Content Tested 2 (content/ skills that will be tested on. Example: writing thesis statements, or how to complete document based-questions) (This can also be a review of the several skills or topics that were covered in previous lessons)

Week of April 17th: Q & A and Test Taking Tips (last minute questions that students have about the test or preparation. Also, presented are test taking tips with a review of what is on the test with examples.)

Signup sheets are created and can be found in the class announcements to reserve your seat for these sessions. You will also find the link to use to enter the study session.

The week of April 24th will be open for students to ask questions and setup individualized sessions with their instructors to review any items of interest. Please contact your teacher to setup times or ask questions.

Attention Juniors and Seniors: if you are planning to apply to a U.S. four-year university this year, you will need a score on a college entrance exam (either the SAT or the ACT). Test dates and registration links can be found below.

Sophomores and Juniors: the PSAT is only offered in October. Now is the time to find a testing location.

Keystone: Monthly Tip of the Trade

Transferring a course:

Students may need or want to transfer a course for a variety of different reasons. A course they are enrolled in may be too hard or too time consuming, or your student may not be interested in the elective chosen during the enrollment process.

Regardless of the reason for transferring a course; there are a few things to keep in mind:

The due date remains the same.

The original due date will remain the same for the transferred course. However, all extension options are available if they are needed.

There are fees involved.

Shipping Fees: You will be required to mail back any materials that came with the original course at your expense. In addition, if there are materials for the new course, there will be a shipping fee which will be included in the total cost for transfer.

<u>Transfer Fees:</u> There is a \$35 transfer fee per course.

Exception: If your student is new and it is within the first 30 days of enrollment, there will not be a transfer fee. If your student is returning, there will not be a fee as long as the course is transferred within five (5) days of enrollment. All other fees will be applied.

Work Done Fees: If the course the student is transferring is over 10% completed, a work done fee of \$100/ course is applied. For any print/correspondence courses, if any work is sent in and graded, the work done fee will be applied.

Discounts: If you received any discounts during the enrollment, those will need to be adjusted accordingly. Cost Difference: If your student is transferring from a print/correspondence course to an online course, there will be cost difference involved which will need to be paid along with any other fees. If your student is transferring from an online course to a print/correspondence course, the cost difference may be put towards your payment plan, or refunded back to the card used at time of enrollment.

Processing time:

If you need to send materials back, we will not process the course transfer until the materials have been received by our warehouse. Once the materials have been received, please allow one to two (1-2) business days for the course transfer to occur. If your student is transferring to an online course, the new course will appear in the homeroom a few hours after the course has been transferred. If your student is transferring to a print/correspondence course, your student will need to wait for the materials to arrive before they can begin the new course.

Withdrawals on the transcript:

If your student transfers a course, the original course will remain on their Keystone transcript as "withdrawn". These courses can only be removed if the course is transferred within the first 30 days of enrollment. You must contact Guidance to remove the withdrawn course.

Restrictions for course transfers include:

We cannot transfer a course if it is over a year old. The student would need to purchase the course as brand new. Please keep this in mind if your student wants to transfer a course and the due date is approaching. They would be starting a brand new course with only a few months to complete it.

Exception: If your student is transferring the course into the first or second semester of the same course. Your student will earn partial credit, and will be able to repurchase the other part of the course to finish out.
